ADMINISTRATIVE GUIDELINES

- A. A Behavior Management Committee shall be formed to ensure that behavior management programs are in accordance with state and federal law and regulations, including the training of personnel for the use of specific procedures, methods, and techniques, and for having a written policy on the use of behavior management techniques and obtaining parental consent prior to the use of highly restraining or intrusive procedures when included in a student's IEP. The Behavior Management Committee may be the Individualized Education Program team and may include:
- a. Special Education Coordinator
 - b. Building Principal
 - c. Teacher
 - d. Psychologist
 - e. Parent, Guardian or Surrogate Parent
 - f. Behavior Shaping Specialists
- B. The Committee's main function is to insure that the student's right to the least intrusive effective intervention is honored and to oversee the use of restraining or intrusive procedures and restraints.
