TITLE: TRANSPORTATION

I. PURPOSE

Transportation for students shall be provided in accordance with law and Board policy.

II. DEFINITIONS

- A. **School bus** means a motor vehicle that is designed to carry eleven (11) passengers or more, including the driver, and is used for the transportation of preprimary, primary or secondary school students to or from public, private or parochial schools or events related to such schools or school-related activities.
- B. **School vehicle** means a motor vehicle, except a motorcycle, designed for carrying no more than ten (10) passengers, including the driver, and used for the transportation of preprimary, primary or secondary school students while registered by or under contract to the school district. The term includes vehicles having chartered, group and party rights under the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission and used for the transportation of school children.

III. POLICY

- A. The Board shall provide transportation for resident students in grades kindergarten through 12 to the district's public schools and charter, regional charter and nonpublic schools located in the district or within the district's transportation boundary or other placements as required by law or agreements. The district's transportation boundary is a distance not exceeding ten (10) miles by the nearest public highway outside the school district's border.
- B. Resident elementary students will be required to attend the elementary school designed for their area of residence. Requests of parents/guardians for a child to attend an elementary school outside the area of residence due to educational needs

must be submitted in writing to the superintendent of school and/or designee. If the request is granted, it will be with the understanding that the parent/guardian provide transportation to and from school. If the school district recommends that a student attend an elementary school outside his/her area of residence on the basis of educational needs, the District will provide transportation to and from school for that student.

- C. The Board shall provide transportation for students living within the prescribed limits when walking conditions to the school are found to be hazardous by the Department of Transportation.
- D. The District will make available transportation to and from school for all elementary students who reside within the District's boundaries and live beyond one-half mile of their school of attendance or to students living within one-half mile if they walk along or cross a state identified hazardous route.
- E. The Board shall provide transportation for students with disabilities, without regard to distance or hazardous walking conditions, when required by the student's individualized education program (IEP) or Section 504 Service Agreement.
- F. The Board shall provide transportation for eligible resident students who are enrolled in nonpublic schools or charter schools as required by law.
- G. The Board shall provide transportation for children in foster care in accordance with federal and state laws and regulations, and the local transportation plan.
- H. The Board shall provide transportation for homeless children and youths in accordance with federal and state laws and regulations.
- I. The Board prohibits any diesel-powered motor vehicle weighing 10,001 pounds or more to idle for more than five (5) minutes in any continuous sixty-minute period while parked, loading or unloading, except as allowed by law.
- J. The Board shall ensure that permanent signs, notifying drivers of the idling restrictions, are maintained on district property at locations where diesel-powered motor vehicles weighing 10,001 pounds or more load or unload. Signs shall also be posted at locations that provide fifteen (15) or more parking spaces for such diesel-powered Student Health information
- K. **Student Health Information**
 - 1. When necessary for student safety, or when required by a student's IEP or Section 504 Service Agreement, a school bus/vehicle driver shall be provided with relevant student health and medical information.

2. School bus/vehicle drivers shall maintain the confidentiality of student health/medical information in accordance with district policies and procedures and applicable law.

L. **Evacuation Drills**

1. Bus evacuation drills shall be conducted twice a year and reported to the Pennsylvania Department of Education, in accordance with law and Board policy.

IV. **DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY**

- A. The school bus/vehicle driver shall be responsible to maintain order while students are being transported.
- B. The school bus/vehicle driver shall report all incidents, including, but not limited to, discipline problems, medical problems, bullying/harassment, safety issues, accidents or injuries, and violations of Pennsylvania's School Bus Stopping Law to the Superintendent or designee as soon as practicable.
- C. The building principal may suspend a student from bus transportation for disciplinary reasons, and the parents/guardians shall be responsible for the student's transportation.
- D. The Superintendent or designee shall:
 1. Maintain records and make required reports regarding school transportation.
 2. Distribute rules governing student conduct during transport; such rules shall be binding on all students transported by the district.
 3. Provide each school bus/school vehicle driver with:
 - a. The Pennsylvania School Bus Driver's Manual;
 - b. The written rules for student conduct on buses/vehicles;
 - c. The procedures for evacuation drills; and
 - d. Any additional laws and applicable Board policies and administrative regulations which apply to school bus/vehicle drivers.
 4. Establish administrative regulations that specify the number of chaperones to accompany students in connection with school-related activities and field trips.

5. Prepare a district map or schedule indicating each bus stop and bus route.
